Constitution

Livingston Athletic Club (the Club) is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO). It was registered in its current legal form on 9 December 2015. The Club was previously an unincorporated association but changed its legal status to a SCIO. The assets of the unincorporated association were transferred to the SCIO on 27 November 2016 following agreement at an extraordinary general meeting of the Club. It has a single tier structure and as such the trustees are members of the charity.

Appointment of Trustees

Members can elect trustees at the Club's Annual General Meeting. All trustees must be full members of the club and not be disqualified from being a charity trustee and not an employee of the club. Trustees are elected for a period of 1 year, but are eligible for re-election. There must be a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 8 trustees.

Management

The activities, strategic development and finances of the Club are overseen by a Board of trustees who meet periodically to consider the Club development plan, financial position and any other material issues.

Objective and Activities

Charitable Purposes

The Club is a non-profit distributing charity whose principal objective is the advancement of participation in Athletics as a sport. This is achieved through the provision of coaching and facilities for participating in Athletics in accordance with the rules and regulations laid down by Scottish Athletics. In furtherance of these objectives, the Club seeks;

- To inspire an active, healthier lifestyle in individuals by encouraging inhabitants to take part in Athletics as a competitive sport.
- To provide recreational facilities, and to organise recreational activities, available to members of the public at large, with the object of improving the conditions of life.

- To advance education particularly among young people, through the provision of training in the skills and techniques of Athletics and demonstrating the values, such as integrity, dignity and respect, thereby encouraging positive relationships in the wider community.
- To do all lawful things which are deemed to further the objectives of the Club.

Activities

The Club provides athletics coaching and competition to members of the community from age 5 upwards, based at Craigswood Sports Centre, Livingston.

The Athletics Club offers training in all athletics disciplines, 4 nights per week, to over 150 children and adults from age 9 upwards, with a structure programme of team and individual competition throughout the year, from local to national level.

For children aged 5-12, the Club offer a recreational "Run, Jump & Throw" programme with weekly sessions during term time and holiday camps during school holidays, for over 130 children per week.

The Club's adult jogging group provides a recreational running opportunity for over 20 adults per week.

A programme of 6 track and field competitions, and 2 cross country competitions, are organised by the Club each year to provide our members with local competition opportunity and to raise funds from guest entries.

The Club's activities are made possible by the commitment and enthusiasm of a number of volunteers who deliver coaching and support the administration and organisation of the Club and events. The volunteer coaching team is supported by several specialist coaches on a self employed basis.

Additionally, the Club employ a part time "Coaching, Pathways and Development Officer" with financial support from Scottish Athletics and West Lothian Council.

Achievements and Performance

2016 was another successful year for the club.

The club's adult recreational running group was launched at the beginning of the year and is now well established with a core of over 20 members. Athlete numbers in our "Run, Jump & Throw" programme for children aged 5-12 doubled over the year from 63 to over 130. Attendance at our summer camp also increased by over 50%.

Our paid "Club Together Officer" role was replaced with a "Coaching, Pathways and Development Officer" - the new post is focussed on recruiting and developing coaches and fostering athlete pathways, to ensure that a vibrant athletics club sits at the centre of sustainable athletics development within the community. There was initial success with this role, with new coaches recruited and capacity at the main athletics club sessions increased to approx. 150 athletes.

Highlights for team performances included: our U15 girls qualifying for the Indoor League final; our junior girls finishing 6th in the East District Cross Country Relay Championships; both the Central & South League and Forth Valley League teams retained their positions in their respective divisions; and the U15 and U17 girls 4x200m teams qualifying for the finals of the National Indoor Relay Championships.

Club athletes also won 7 individual medals at National Championships across sprints, jumps and combined events.

We continued to work closely with our partners at West Lothian Council and support their programme of schools athletics events, ensuring that there is a defined pathway from school athletics to club athletics.

Financial Review

The club's total income for the year was $\pounds 56,975$, with the main sources of income being training fees ($\pounds 36,164$) and entry fees from events ($\pounds 5,624$).

Expenditure for the year total £53,157, with the main expenses being facility hire costs (£11,900), competition entry (£7,054) and coaching (£6,104).

Overall this resulted in a small surplus of £3,817.

Reserves Policy

The charity's policy is to hold reserves that are equal to approximately 6 months of expenditure to cover any unpredictable circumstances.

Plans for Future Period

The club continues to grow and develop in line with its development plan.

To support the increased demand for training at the club, particularly in our recreational athletics programmes, we will be seeking to recruit additional paid coaches.

We will continue to work constructively with our partners at Scottish Athletics to develop the structure and governance of the Club.

Building on the successes of this year, the Club look for increased event participation and further success in 2017.

Trustees' responsibilities in relation to the financial statements

The charity trustees are responsible for preparing a trustees' annual report and financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice). The law applicable to charities in Scotland requires the charity trustees to prepare financial statements for each year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources, of the charity for that period. In preparing the financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the applicable Charities SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charity Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended), and the provisions of the Trust deed. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

The trustees are responsible for the maintenance and integrity of the charity and financial information included on the charity's website. Legislation in the United Kingdom governing the preparation and dissemination of financial statements may differ from legislation in other jurisdictions.

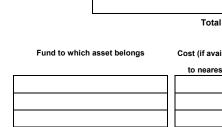

Nature and purpose of funds

The restricted grant funds contribute towards the cost of the club's development staff as part of the Scottish Athletics Club Together Project; towards the costs of our community Run, Jump & Throw athletics sessions and holiday camps; towards the costs of training and education for our coaching team; and towards ours series of local track & field events and cross country events.
